2012 ANNUAL OPERATIONS REPORT

It gives me great joy and fulfillment to have to do and present this annual report in our fifth year of existence and the fourth year of operations. It has indeed been a great journey of faith with big breakthroughs, some nothing short of miracles and with great challenges, some of which we are yet to overcome.

ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

National Secretariat

We obtained office space from The Sheepfold Ministries for free. Possible rent would have been not less than Kshs.10, 000.00 per month. Furniture and office equipment are already in place. We are faced with shortage of storage space though since the Executive Director, whose house had served as our store for drugs and supplies, moved out of Nairobi.

Our brother, Peter Njihia became our ministry administrator and continued to serve as editor, communications officer and coordinator on a volunteer basis. We are struggling to raise a stipend for him and we kindly ask that partners help us in this area.

Carol Kivanga transitioned into marriage and consequently moved to Mombasa. We wish her and her husband Mr. Fred Amariati, a happy and blessed marriage.

Regional Cluster Groups

It is the conviction of the board that we need to decentralize our operations and empower Christian professionals to serve the communities nearer to them. The board also believes in the precept that prayer knows no boundaries. At the turn of 2011, we had two Cluster Groups at Nairobi and Mombasa, mostly meeting regularly to pray. We now have two new clusters; Tenwek Hospital led by Sharon Chepkirui and Eldoret led by Christine Wekesa. We plan to get others going at Kijabe Hospital and Nakuru as soon as the logistics allow us to.

The Nairobi group continues but since mid-year 2012 we lost a place for meetings. Our host church, Hekima Center relocated from the city center to Thika Road. We still need to find a place for this purpose.

Notably, we started engagement in cross border missions work and missions’ mobilization conferences, which we hope to continue.

Others Services

True to our commitment to capacity building and growing the ability of Christian professionals to serve as leaders/managers in Church, health facilities and the nation at large as well as prepare them to be effective missionaries wherever they go; the ministry and its partners were involved in the following trainings:

Leadership – this involved a revival weekend meeting at Egerton University, Faculty of Health Sciences on 21-23rd January out of which mentorship on leadership and mentorship is ongoing. Leadership seminars were held in January, March and August at the Medical School, University of Nairobi and the Kenya Medical Training College, Nakuru Campus in partnership with FOCUS Kenya.

Health Services Management – in 2012 we started the process of equipping Facility Committees at church based dispensaries and health centers. The first training was held at AGC Naikarra Health Center on 28th July but the second in September 8th was pushed to 2013 owing to logistical issues.

Missionary Sending

Having been unable to fully fund frontier missionaries we got into collaborations with organizations to provide staff who are willing to serve, whilst those churches/missions agencies will meet the salaries/stipends required. We seconded Sarah to Sheepfold in Northern Kenya and Barazah to International Aid Services/Africa Gospel Church in Nyingbuli, Republic of South Sudan.

We need 4-6 more nurses and clinical officers in 2013 if funding is availed.

Missions Mobilization

Our first missions mobilization seminar was held on 29th April at Mulago Hospital, Kampala – Uganda. We trained 70 health personnel from 11 hospitals and training schools including Makerere Medical School and the Mulago School of nursing on missions work, with some bias on medical missions. The later planned seminars at Nyeri MTC and Mombasa MTC did not materialize. This work will be continued in 2013 starting with the DR Congo team of 70 clinicians.

STRATEGIC PLAN DEVELOPMENT

The last strategic plan comes to an end on December 31st, 2012. A working group was set up by the board to provide ideas and technical support in drafting the 2013- 2017 five year strategic plan. Consultations have been done and the draft is in final stages
